Directions / Parking: Museum entrance faces Gervais Street. Traveling west on Gervais, it is just beyond the intersection of Gervais and Huger – and before the Gervais Street bridge. There is ample parking in front of the museum, including handicapped spaces and front door drop-off.

From I-26 West: Take I-26 E toward Columbia. Bear right onto Huger St. exit. Go 4 stop lights to Gervais St. Turn right onto Gervais; museum entrance is 1/2-block on the right.

From Blythewood: Take I-77 S. Exit right onto US 277 S. Follow 277 into town where it becomes Bull St. Continue on Bull to Gervais St. Turn right onto Gervais. After the 8th traffic light (at Huger St), museum entrance is 1/2-block on the right.

From NE Columbia: Take I-20 W. Exit right onto US 277 S. Follow 277 into town where it becomes Bull St. Continue on Bull to Gervais St. Turn right onto Gervais. After the 8th light (at Huger St.), museum entrance is 1/2-block on the right.
